YOUR HEALTH--AGE RELATED EYE PROBLEMS

You've always loved to read, but lately you must use extra-large-print books. Sometimes, the sun seems extremely bright or on-coming headlights make it difficult for you to focus. You make an appointment with your eye doctor for a complete eye exam to check for age-related eye disorders.

The two most common eye disorders in aging adults are cataracts and glaucoma. CATARACTS are cloudy areas in the lens in front of the eye. If they become large or too thick, they can be surgically removed and replaced with a clear plastic lens. This will usually restore normal vision.

GLAUCOMA is caused by increased pressure inside the eye. There are usually no early symptoms or pain. Your doctor will assess your optic nerve, eye pressure and test your visual field.

The key thing is to see your eye doctor regularly for exams and to take precautions if you have diabetes or have a family history of eye disease.
